# Rewind: CB/ VISITING SIX CBM CHURCH

Six church plants and 1,788 miles in six days—that was the agenda for 2021 CBM Sampler. Three men with an interest in church planting joined CBM Field Director **Brad Hoff** on a journey from Michigan to Maryland and back again.

- DAY 1 of the Sampler began with an early morning trip from the CBM office across the state of Michigan to worship with the people of Common Grounds Baptist Church in Detroit. Led by CBM missionaries Bill & Tamra Branks, Common Grounds meets in a rented space that also serves as a coffee shop run by the church plant as a means of outreach to their community. This visit gave the Sampler participants the opportunity to see a church plant in action on a Sunday morning.
- On the morning of **DAY 2**, the Sampler group met up with CBM church planters **Bill Taylor** and **Ken Dockery**, and Caleb Kudlow, another member of the pastoral staff at CityView Baptist Church, in downtown Cleveland, Ohio. The group was able to see the facility CityView had recently begun using as a meeting place for the church plant. A tour of the central part of Cleveland gave the group the opportunity to see several of the places where CityView has significant ongoing ministries, such as Cleveland State University, a high-rise apartment building, and a local park.

**DAY 3** provided a unique opportunity—the chance to meet a church planter and tour the community he has targeted before a church planting effort has officially begun. Nathan & Christie Robbins are CBM church planting-appointees headed to Buffalo, New York. Nathan arranged his deputation schedule to meet the Sampler group in Buffalo and lead a walking tour of the neighborhood the Lord has laid on their hearts. Participants learned to view a community through "church planting eyes". The visit to that neighborhood concluded with a time of prayer for the people of the community and for the future church plant. (Incidentally, Nathan Robbins was a participant on the 2019 CBM Sampler!)



## Sampler Six Days!

- After three consecutive days of surveying urban church plants, **DAY 4** provided a change of pace. Grace Baptist Church of Juniata County, Pennsylvania, is a rural church plant led by CBM church planters **Dennis & Tamra Seiler**. After a church planting conversation over supper, the Sampler group had the privilege of joining the Grace Baptist family for their mid-week Bible study and prayer time.
- On the morning of **DAY 5**, the group met up with CBM missionary **Kurt Schroder** at the Gettysburg National Military Park for a battlefield tour led by Kurt. (As a bi-vocational church planter, Kurt works in the bookstore at the visitors' center.) That afternoon and evening the Sampler participants visited with Kurt and his wife, **Lori** regarding their small-town church plant (Good News Baptist Church) in Cascade, Maryland.
- The **FINAL** church planting visit took place in Bowie, Maryland, where CBM missionaries Jeff & Deb Minniear are planting Shiloh Baptist Church. In addition to having lunch together in a local park where Shiloh has had significant outreach activities, the aroup also visited the Minniears' home where weekly ministry takes place in the form of small group worship times, spiritual discussion groups, and children's Bible clubs. A special point of interest was seeing Jeff's workshop where he crafts violins and violas (See 'Hearts In Tune' in this issue!)

The effectiveness of the trip can be summarized in the words of one of this year's participants: "The CBM Sampler is a unique opportunity to expose oneself to what church planting looks like on the ground. It is easy to discuss opinions from a theory but seeing it firsthand in multiple venues was a true eye-opener."

SOWING GOSPEL SEEDS ONE VIOLIN AT A

Someone wisely said, "When you want to reach the lost, find out what you like to do and figure out how to do it with unsaved people." Blend that with the biblical command to "do good" to all, and the wheels started turning for CBM missionaries, Jeff & Deb Minniear who are planting Shiloh Baptist Church in Bowie, Maryland. Both Jeff and Deb love music and playing stringed instruments. As they sifted through ideas for how to build redemptive relationships by investing in their community, the couple landed on helping the strings program in their local public schools.

An initial contact at a nearby elementary school revealed a need for five beginner violins. Rather than buying cheap violins, Jeff decided to make them. When they were ready, the Minniears invited the strings teacher over to play the instruments. She loved them! In the course of conversation, Jeff and Deb learned this teacher also taught strings at a second school, so Jeff made another set of violins. The Minniears had just started pursuing this ministry idea when the Covid-19 pandemic hit and local schools shifted to a virtual format. With kids back in the classroom this fall, ten new violins will be delivered in the next few weeks.

Jeff is also building violas for two middle schools, one in Bowie and the other closer to Washington DC. While building them, he realized if these schools had trouble getting violas for needy students, they must need cellos even more. The **Minniears** approached their chiropractor with Jeff Minniear a unique idea: Would he buy a used cello if Jeff could make it playable for the school? He agreed! When the strings teacher picked up the instruments Jeff had made, he showed her the (not yet repaired) cello intended for her school and she cried. (Apparently there are several broken cellos in school storage just

Through this ministry the Minniears are prayerfully seeking to build relationships with teachers and schools, as well as with students and their parents, as many of the children will need larger instruments as they grow. To this end, business cards introducing Jeff as the instrument builder and the Minniears as church planters, as well as a card explaining how gifts from various Christians and churches paid to make the instrument possible, are included in each case. Jeff and Deb believe this is a long-term investment that will not only help the schools and the children, but by God's grace, open doors for the gospel—the greatest hope!

#### **BUILDING MINISTRIES PROJECT UPDATES**

Five missionary builder families are currently assisting **Chardon Baptist Church in Chardon**, **Ohio** with an addition that extends the auditorium and includes a new platform, warming pantry, serving area, classroom space, a family restroom, utility and storage closets, a mechanical deck for the HVAC system, and a new entry and sidewalk. Extensive remodeling will provide the church with a new auditorium ceiling, foam insulation, new lighting, central heat and AC in the auditorium, and updates to the existing entry and restrooms. Due to project zoning, arrangements were made for the builders to park their RV homes in a nearby mobile home community. Though not as convenient, this location has opened up additional ministry opportunities! The missionaries are endeavoring to build relationships with their neighbors in the park and connect them with the church family. A one-on-one Bible study has already started up. The builders are also serving in the church through special music and children's ministries.

A second project is underway at **First Baptist Church of Hermon**, **New York** with CBM builders and volunteers assisting with repairs to the church's clock bell tower. Initial work included building a beam to hold up the floor and the tower. A large concrete cap over a stone wall was poured in the crawl space to shore up the foundation. Two of the main tower support beams were rotted at the base and required repair before work overhead could commence. Due to significant rot damage, the building team tore the clock tower down to the bell tower. In its place, an 8-foot tower and a 6-foot-6-inch spire were constructed, with steel roofing sheets bent on site for the spire. This is a unique project that has involved a lot of angles!
